

Serving Michigan residents with Disabilities, Illness, and Special Needs

Music therapy is the clinical and evidence-based use of music interventions to accomplish individualized goals within a therapeutic relationship by a credentialed professional who has completed an approved music therapy program. (*American Music Therapy Association, www.musictherapy.org*)



Music therapists are independently certified through the **Certification Board** for **Music Therapists** (www.cbmt.org) after completing a bachelor's or master's degree; at least 1200 hours of supervised clinical training, including an internship after all coursework is completed; and passing a national board certification exam. **Board certified music therapists (MT-BC)** work within a scope of practice, adhere to a code of professional practice, and demonstrate current competency in the profession. Additionally, board certified music therapists must meet extensive continuing education and recertification requirements every five years.

Over **22,000** Michigan residents received music therapy services between Oct. 1, 2012 & Sept. 30, 2013.*

As an established allied health profession, board certified music therapists in Michigan, along with the American Music Therapy Association (AMTA) and the Certification Board for Music Therapists (CBMT), strongly recommend that music therapy and the MT-BC credential be formally recognized in Michigan. This is essential for ensuring the safety of Michigan residents and for increasing their access to quality, evidence -based music therapy services.

The state of Michigan has led the way in educational programs for music therapists. The first music therapy training program in the United States began at **Michigan State University** in 1944. Currently, two Michigan universities offer degrees in music therapy: **Western Michigan** and **Eastern Michigan**. There are currently four active National roster internship sites in Michigan: Franciscan Life Process Center (Lowell, MI); Keidan Center—Detroit Public Schools; Lighthouse Neurological Rehabilitation Center (Caro, MI); and Seasons Hospice & Palliative Care of Michigan (Madison Heights, MI). Additionally, there are a number of university-affiliated internship sites throughout the state.




